

## Free Amateur Radio Technician Licensing (level 1) Class

**When:** Friday, May 30, 2025 through Saturday, June 14, 2025. Watch lectures online at your convenience in the comfort of your home with Q&A sessions every 2 days via Zoom. The optional license exam will occur Saturday, Exam is Saturday June 14, 2025 starting at 12:30 PM.

**Where:** Online class, via YouTube videos and Zoom review sessions. The optional in-person license exam session will be in West Seattle at Seattle Public Library Highpoint Branch: 3411 S.W. Raymond St., Seattle, WA 98126

**Cost:** No fee for class. Optional licensing exam: \$15 fee to ARRL for processing and \$35 fee for the license, paid to the FCC For children 18 and under a \$5 overall fee (exam plus license) is offered.

**Book:** ARRL License Manual, level 1 (Technician), 5th edition (2022 – 2026). Also available on Kindle.

You are not required to take the exam on the last day if you feel you need more time to study. Note that a General Class (level 2) course is being given after this class (June 13 -June 29).
